## Speech

## Presented by NAITO Yasushi, Consul-General of Japan in Perth On the occasion of the Opening of the WA Kendo Renmei State Championship Tuesday March 7, 2023

Mr Brian Brestovac, President of the Western Australian Kendo Renmei, Hayashi Sensei, Fukumoto Sensei, Executive Committee and members of Western Australian Kendo Renmei, Good Morning.

Thank you for the introduction. I am NAITO Yasushi, Consul-General of Japan in Perth. It is my honour and pleasure to make remarks at the opening of the Western Australian Kendo Remmei State Championship 2023.

Molding of mind and body and cultivating of healthy and strong spirit, learning of esteem courtesy and honor,

advancing of self improvement at all time while associating with others with faithfulness and integrity, and love your society and contribute to peace and prosperity of humanity.

It is philosophy of Budo at large that because you have only three things in the life, your mind, your body and everything else, Budo is a way of better connect you mind, you body and the environment surround you including sustainable interaction with nature with deep appreciation.

In the context of Sport, it has great potential to connect people. Sport has power to inspire people, power to unite differences and encourage people in adversity in a way that little else does. Australia is renoun for sports loving nation of which 15 million out of 25 million population is active in sports. Sport can change the world and so you can.
