I was at the Shinju Matsuri in Broome last week and today I am at the South West Japan Festival. The

journey started by Japanese pearl divers humbles us all. Despite challenging days, they loved the land and people of Australia and became a bridge between the two nations. That heritage became an inspiration to many Japanese residents in Western Australian who have followed and forged friendships with many Australians. I firmly believe people-to-people bonds on the ground, based on mutual trust that has been built over the years, are the most important asset of the remarkable relationship between Japan and Western Australia.
