I wish to express my sincere appreciation to Mr Sutherland and all the officials of Fremantle Ports for welcoming the delegation of the Nagoya Port Authority. The twin-port relationship between Fremantle Ports and Nagoya Ports is now over 40 years and it constitutes a firm basis of people-to-people personal bonds between Japan and Western Australia, as well as trade and investment including energy and resources that led to the remarkable economic success of Japan and Australia.
