(Words of Welcome)

I wish to welcome the 90 students from Tokyo City University on the TAP Program to Perth. This is a great opportunity to learn, experience and make friends with people from different cultures. It is a real life-changing experience and after the 16 weeks, how you see Australia, Japan and the world will be very different. Have fun and try to make most of it. This can be a turning point for your futures.

(Bilateral Relations)

Japan and Western Australia share very strong ties that have been built over many years. Yesterday, we saw news of Mitsui & Co making an 8 billion dollars investment to one of the world's biggest iron ore deposits in Western Australia.

53% of Japan's imported iron ore, 30% of LNG and 15% of wheat, ideal for udon noodles, are from Western Australia. Japan's imported sugar, beef and canola oil are also from Australia. Western Australia is everywhere in our daily life in Japan.

(Expanding people-to-people exchange)

In 2024, more than 920,000 Australians visited Japan, a 50% increase from 2023, marking an all-time high. In Western Australia, the resumption of the ANA Perth to Narita direct flight was the biggest breakthrough, now operating all year round.

With the Osaka Kansai Expo from April to October, well over 1 million Australians are expected to visit Japan this year. So tell your Australian friends about Japan, including tips for enjoying travel and life in Japan.

(Goodwill ambassadors between Japan and Australia)

We have 8,500 Japanese citizens living in Western Australia, and Japanese language is one of the most popular foreign languages taught in government schools. You will find friendliness and a remarkable understanding of Japan among people all around you. This shows the level of mutual trust built over the years through people-to-people interactions between Japan and Australia, and is something we should cherish deeply.

Last week, I had the honour of presenting the Order of the Rising Sun, Gold Rays with Rosette, upon Mr Arun Radha Krishnan, who taught Japanese politics, economics and society at UWA and Murdoch University for over 30 years. Many prominent leaders in the Japan-WA community have emerged having studied under Krishnan Sensei, including Prof Sandra Wilson, Diane Rimmer and others, and each one with their own remarkable journeys of human bonds and connection to Japan.

Thanks to these remarkable efforts sustained for half a century, we have many goodwill ambassadors who bridge Japan and Australia, and for the next 16 weeks you will find yourself to be goodwill ambassadors of Japan.

(Perth Japan Festival and other excitement)

A major event on our calendar each year is the Perth Japan Festival, a day where the Japanese and WA community come together to celebrate Japanese culture, music and food, and we would like to encourage you all to join, as either volunteers or participants.

The 11th Perth Japan Festival will be held on Saturday the 15th of March at the Supreme Court Gardens, and we welcome you to experience the Japanese festival with Japanese taiko, Bon Odori, tea ceremony, martial arts, ikebana flower arranging and pop culture all showcased in one place. Last year, 20,000 people attended the Perth Japan Festival and attendance is growing each year.

And enjoy hosting your own Japan Festival at Murdoch University. Through these interactions, you will be surprised to see we have so many friends of Japan in Perth, and I am sure it will be an unforgettable experience during your stay in Western Australia.

(Words of Appreciation)

I am sad to say that this is my last chance to welcome TCU students to Murdoch University as I am leaving Perth at the end of February to my new posting. I wish to take this occasion to express my sincere appreciation to the professors and staff of Murdoch University for supporting this excellent program and for guiding and caring for the students.

Your efforts have contributed to the mutual understanding between our two countries and we will continue to see its impact in the years to come.

This week, I had a farewell call on Premier Cook, a graduate of Murdoch University and who is a great supporter of student exchange with Japan.
